COED SUMMER PROGRAM!
June 16-August 22

GSS has designed ten **theme weeks** for the Summer Program. Theme weeks are an excellent way to learn about particular subjects in greater depth, as well as a dynamic way to use cross-curricular activities. Please keep in mind that the theme for each week does not limit the scope of the activities, but instead provides a vehicle by which students can engage in multiple subjects.

Daily schedules will include activities pertaining to the following subject areas:

- Reading
- Writing
- Math
- History/Geography
- Art/Music

*Daily schedules will also include “booster” activity times, during which students will strive to better their skills in math, spelling, and reading.

Ten Theme Weeks:

June 16th – June 20th = *All about Me*: Students will learn all about how to be a “healthy me”; including nutrition, healthy teeth, how to stay safe and self-esteem. Special activities may include a trip to Safetyville, self-portraiture, understanding nutritional needs and values, and daily healthy habits.

June 23rd – June 27th = *Geography*: Students will become globe trotters of our Earth and learn about ecosystems, their climates, and the animals inhabiting them. Activities may include a trip to the zoo, planting a garden and designing an island with numerous land and water features.

June 30th – July 3rd (Closed July 4th) = *Art*: Students will explore artists from a variety of eras and countries and create their own masterpieces. Activities may include a visit to Crocker Museum and/or local artists’ studios.

July 7th – July 11th = *Drama*: Students will immerse themselves into the many genres of drama; including plays, movies, stand-up comedy, and musicals. Activities may include puppet making, role-acting, and a visit to the Sacramento Philharmonic Orchestra.

July 14th – July 18th = *Crazy about Candy*: Students learn everything about the history, science, and math of candy making. Activities may include creating art with candy, travelling to the Jelly Belly Factory, and using candy to understand probability.

July 21st – July 25th = *California History*: Students will learn all about California. Field Trips may include a ride on the Central Pacific Railroad, panning for gold, and a visit to the State Capitol grounds and other local historical sites.

July 28th – Aug 1st = *Sports and Fitness*: Students will learn about different sports and the importance of co-operation, team building activities, playing by the rules and active bodies. A certified trainer will come to teach about fitness.

Aug 4th – Aug 8th = *Reading Week*: Students will explore their favorite book/authors and be able to share them with the other students through book reports, plays, artwork and discussion. Some examples of books that will be explored are Junie B Jones and Dr. Seuss. Would you eat Green Eggs and Ham??

Aug 11th – Aug 15th = *Math Week*: Time to crunch some numbers and have some fun while we explore the world of mathematics including the history of math, early counting systems, Roman numerals, formulas used in art and science, and how math is used every day. Activities may include planning a grocery list and a trip to the store. Extra tutoring will be offered to those who are interested in boosting math skills.

Aug 18th – Aug 22nd = *Outer space, our Earth and the Environment*: Time to shoot for the stars as we explore the planetary system. Why is our Earth a great place to live? How can we keep our world clean and safe? How would we survive without water? Activities may include trips to local farms, the planetarium, recycling, and studying the water cycle.
